Vanessa Glushefski

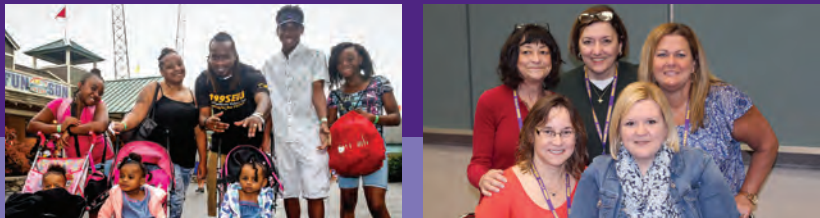
FOR ERIE COUNTY COMPTROLLER
